Mitzi Zoya is a minister of walking prayer through the Center for Sacred Studies and sound healing facilitator. She supports healing in a natural way through toning, chanting, and medicine songs, accompanied by traditional instruments from around the world.

Inspired by the teachings of the Int'l Council of 13 Indigenous Grandmothers, a key part of Zoya's spiritual work is to give our ancestors a voice through musical expression for generational healing, past, present, and future.
